It's great to have a BarChart like this that has both styles covered, even though, personally, I think it would be better to have two separate charts-one for each style. That way, more information can be covered. There are always style and formatting questions for even experienced paper writers, so it's good to have something in your hands to look at instead of always relying on the Internet.
