He becomes an inheritor of the funded capital of civilization. The most formal and technical education in the world cannot safely depart from this general process. It can only organize it; or differentiate it in some particular direction.â€ During his time at the University of Chicago, Dewey also founded the University of Chicago Laboratory Schools to deliver his pedagogical beliefs â€œto prepare him for the future life means to give him command of himself; it means so to train him that he will have the full and ready use of all his capacitiesâ€ • His educational thought of â€œLearning by Doingâ€ • also formed the foundation of the opening of Indian Springs School, Alabama in 1952, one of the best boarding schools in the United States. The school has adapted John Deweyâ€™s pedagogical beliefs in its longstanding motto, Learning through Living. John Deweyâ€™s influence has been felt in nearly every field of the humanities, sciences, and American corporate culture such learning by doing. The reasoning by John Dewey still remains as relevant today as it was then.
